CHB 2022 AGM MINUTES

Location: Online (MS Teams)

1. Call to Order

Callum called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm with quorum present.

2. Approval of Agenda

Items added by Callum: 2024 APA Canadian National Bid discussion, President's Message and Treasurer's report. Mike S moved to approve the agenda with additions as noted. Rico seconded. Carried.

3. Approval of 2021 AGM Minutes

The minutes from the 2021 AGM had been distributed with the January Newsletter. Callum summarized the main topics. Rico S. moved to approve the minutes as distributed, Jean K. seconded. Carried.

4. Message from the President

Callum gave a summary of CHB's activities during 2022. While Covid was less of a factor this year, the Avian Flu disrupted poultry show plans. A successful dairy goat show was held in Edmonton in July and the exhibitors who attended expressed appreciation. Go Edmonton has indicated they will be happy to work with our group again in the future. The annual November show was rescheduled to January, and along with a new date came the decision to host a double show and include pigeons as well.

5. Treasurer's Report

Mike S. presented the financial report for 2021, which indicated a net loss of \$907.60. At this time, we have \$20,199 in cash assets, which includes grant funding of \$6,544 to be spent on the January Show. Proceeds from the goat show netted \$800.00.

Callum responded to a question from Bryan regarding the ability of our club to continue to host goat shows under the proposed new name and bylaw changes. Dairy goat exhibitors have expressed interest in forming their own association, and if that happens they would likely take over hosting the shows. In the mean time our club could choose to continue with goat shows as a fund-raising project.

Also on the topic of finances, Bryan questioned whether the change of name could impact our ability to qualify for grants in the future. Kathy explained that while some past grants have been awarded through Alberta Agriculture, this year there was no agricultural requirement. Our group must prove that our show provided a cultural benefit to the community by reducing isolation and by including a learning component. When applying for agricultural grants in the future, having "Poultry Breeders" in the name should help to validate our connection to agriculture.

6. New Business

a. Special Resolution/Bylaw amendments

Callum explained the rationale behind the proposal to rename the association. The board feels it is important to have a name that accurately reflects the scope and purpose of our mandate. While this change won't really affect our day to day operations, it will help us be more successful in meeting the expectations of our membership base without the added pressure to do more.

The revised bylaws are identical to the current CHB version with only the name changed throughout. The proposed amendments were distributed to all members in good standing on October 23rd, 2022.

MOTION:

Rico Sebastianelli moved to approve a special resolution to change the name of Canadian Heritage Breeds Association to Alberta Poultry Breeders Association, repeal the exiting bylaws, and replace them with the amended bylaws as circulated on October 23rd 2022. Any minor language edits needed to comply with Alberta Societies Act requirements will be considered pre-approved by the membership.

Kris Skeels seconded the motion.

No members were opposed.

The motion passed unanimously.

b. Elections

<u>Director #4</u> Mike Grover has completed his 3-year term.

Nomination: Callum nominated Tamara Taylor. Tamara accepted the nomination. With no further nominations, Tamara was elected by acclamation.

<u>Treasurer</u> Mike Skeels announced his resignation after two years of serving as Treasurer. Nomination: Callum nominated Brittany Hutchings. Brittany accepted the nomination. With no further nominations, Brittany was elected by acclamation.

c. APA National Show 2024 bid

Every year the APA designates one show in Canada as the National meet. Members expressed agreement in submitting a bid to host the National in 2024. Callum will prepare a bid and have it submitted to the APA by January 1st.

Further conversation took place around the timing of the name change. Jean was concerned the January show presents a tight timeline to have all the changes in place. Kathy agreed, and suggested we could introduce the new name and branding at the show, but the full transition will take more time.

Bryan announced that since the APA District show was cancelled this year, one of our double shows in January will be designated the 2022 APA District meet.

7. Adjournment

Callum wrapped up the meeting with a thank you to the outgoing board members and a welcome to the new ones. An orientation meeting and some board level planning will be arranged in the weeks ahead.

Rico moved to adjourn at 7:41 pm.
